Staying Connected with Community Leaders, Nonprofits and Local Businesses

I am grateful to be raising my family in the district and meeting with community leaders is one of the things I enjoy most about serving in Congress. My staff and I visited cities across the region to hear firsthand from government leaders, nonprofits, businesses and neighbors. We toured dozens of sites to learn about the needs in the community and the visionary work being done to address quality of life issues. We also received updates on community projects that are benefiting from the federal funding I advocated for in Congress. I look forward to more *Day in the District* tours in 2025.

Delivering More Than \$14 Million for Our Community

I was proud to bring home funding for 15 community projects that will help upgrade critical infrastructure, improve parks and recreational amenities, and enhance transportation safety. This includes **\$850,000 for renovations to the Martin Luther King Jr. Center, \$700,000 for stormwater infrastructure upgrades, \$1.6 million to improve Centennial Way Trail, and \$3.2 million for roadway safety and streetscapes districtwide.** Visit my website for a full list of projects.

Fighting for Critical Legislation

I am excited to share that several of my legislative efforts made progress this Congress:

PASSED: Authored provisions in the *Federal Aviation Administration's Reauthorization Act of 2024* that will help address climate change by investing in modern, green alternatives to aviation fuel.

PASSED: Authored changes in this year's *Water Resources Development Act* to increase federal support for projects that protect communities from extreme storms, flood risks and sea level rise.

WORKING ACROSS THE AISLE: Led a bipartisan effort to increase funding for *Urban Search & Rescue (US&R) System Task Forces*, which respond across the country when disasters strike.

INTRODUCED: Fighting to improve affordability for working families by introducing the *Poverty Line Act*, which would modernize the way the federal poverty line is calculated.

INTRODUCED: Led the *Weatherization Resilience and Adaptation Program (WRAP) Act*, which would help homeowners and affordable housing providers make homes more resilient to natural disasters.

INTRODUCED: Championed the *Serious Noise Reduction Efforts (SNORE) Act* to help with airport noise by enabling SFO to insulate hundreds of homes per year.

INTRODUCED: The *Earthquake Resilience Act* which would require a national risk assessment of earthquake resilience to better prepare our communities for disasters.

INTRODUCED: The *Driver Technology and Pedestrian Safety Act* which would study the potential effects of technology, like touch screens, on distracted driving.

INTRODUCED: The *Filipino Veterans Fairness Act* would restore benefits to Filipino veterans who fought under U.S. command in World War II and their survivors.

Helping Constituents

During the 118th Congress, my office is proud to have responded to **75,647 letters, emails and calls** from concerned constituents, **resolved 3,102 cases, and returned \$2.1 million** back to constituents.

Services I am Proud to Offer

My staff and I are standing by to help resolve issues you may be experiencing with a federal agency such as Medicare and Social Security, veterans benefits, passports and visas, or immigration issues. We also assist with Capital Tour Requests.
